Free International University Amsterdam

Established in 1979 by Joseph Beuys, FIU Amsterdam is part of a network of artists and thinkers specialising in art informed by social, political and ecological awareness. Their activities include interdisciplinary research, publications, archive, and social sculpture. Four members of FIU Amsterdam will be coming to York: Waldo Bien, Carl Griskes, Uwe Claus and Sebastian Bien. In their project space they will be showing texts, videos and works from their world university art collection and engaging with the public. They will also be planting an oak tree and placing a stone in York as part of their ongoing project 7000 Oaks.


